Minutes of the June monthly meeting

These were accepted as written (proposer C'Ilr June Crook, seconder C'Ilr Rhys Jones).

Matters arising

Affordable housing. C'Ilr David Wildman had been advised by Lyn Hambidge (P.C.C.) that the survey document should be distributed to local residents after the planned public meeting, scheduled to be held in October. Members were informed that a prior notification of the meeting had been placed in the latest In Touch newsletter.

Bus shelters. Members were informed that painting had not yet been carried out.

Overhanging trees on the bridleway at Back Lane. C'Ilr David Wildman had spoken with the tree owners, who had agreed to look at the matter.

No Entry signs. Sardis. C'Ilr Barbara Summons mentioned that the signs did not line up, creating confusion to road users, Concerns were also raised as to the legality of the current positioning of the signs, as well as the lack of maintenance of the sign faces. Clerk to write to P.CC regarding the matter.

Dumping opposite Westaway Park. Members were concerned at the ongoing problem of dumping of earth and rubbish, and requested that the matter be raised in the next In Touch issue, if the problem persists.

Discussion about affordable housing questionnaire

Because of advice received, members decided to defer detailed discussion about the survey until after the public meeting, to be held on October 4th.

Discussion of In Touch donations

[Note - C'Ilr David Wildman declared an interest in the matter, and did not participate in the discussion or voting]

After some discussion, members felt it appropriate to raise the level of support for In Touch, It was decided that the £40 cheque issued last month should count as a donation to the February issue, for which no invoice had been received at the time, A further donation of £180 was approved, to count for the entire years3 s donations from April 2005 - March 2006. It was further agreed that the matter be reviewed in the precept meeting to be held in January 2006. (Proposer C'Ilr Barbara Summons, seconder C'Ilr Alan Taylor).

Discussion of support for the Radio Pembrokeshire campaign to avert loss of fire cover

Some Members voiced the opinion that, in view of the LNG proposals, fire cover should not be cut down at all It was further thought by C'Ilr Alan Taylor that the risk assessments carried out in relation to the LNG project was based on current not projected, fire cover levels. However, Members decided to defer further discussion on the matter, since C'Ilr Colin Rogers, who had placed the matter on the agenda, was not present Clerk to place on September agenda

Bottle bank. C'lr Alan Taylor expressed appreciation that a complaint made to the County Council about glass spilled onto the ground around the bottle bank had been dealt with very speedily, with the glass being cleared up the same day.
