Minutes of monthly meeting held at the Village Hall, Rosemarket on Monday 12th September 2005

Apologies: C'hrs David Wildman, David Barraah, June Crook.
Present: Cllr's Tony Young (Vice-chairman), Rhys Jones, Barbara Summons M.B.E., Alan Taylor, Peter Hortoti (Clerk),

In the absence of the Chairman, the meeting was chaired by the vice-chairman, Cllr Tony Young.

Before the commencement of the meeting, all those present observed a one minute silence in respect of the recent loss of Mr Crook, husband to C'llr June Crook.

Matters arising

No Entry signs. Sardis. Members were informed that the had been moved, but not to exactly opposite one another It was apparent that a problem still existed with some individuals going past the signs in the wrong direction. Clerk to write to P.CC requesting that the be correctly positioned, and that white marker posts be erected to delineate the carriageway edge, and prevent inconsiderate parking on the green.

Back Lane. Members were informed that the work to reduce the overhanging trees still remained to be done. The problem of dumping on the lane was also mentioned as an ongoing problem. C'llr Alan Taylor suggested that an organised litter pick would be a good idea. Clerk to mention the suggestion to C'llr David Wildman

Affordable housing meeting, October 4th. Clerk to check with Cllr David Wildman that the hall had been booked for the meeting.

Honeyborough roundabout Some Members expressed concern at the litter and illegal signs on the roundabout However, it was decided that it would not be appropriate to take any action, as the roundabout lies outside tiie Rosemarket community area.

Discussion of support for Radio Pembrokeshire campaign to oppose eitte to fire cover in Pembrokeshire

Members decided to defer further discussion until October, when C'llr David Wildman was hoped to be in attendance.

Discussion of protection of Beacon from possible illegal camping/discussion of repair of access gates

C'llr Barbara Summons had heard of a possible case of people "eying up" the Beacon for potential illegal encampment purposes. She felt that the bottom gate should be kept locked, and also expressed concern at the condition of the top gate. Cllr Alan Taylor mentioned that P.C.C. Uses the top gate for access to cut the grass. Members voted to purchase a new top gate at a likely cost of £50-60 (proposer C'llr Barbara Summons, seconder Cllr Alan Taylor. C'llr Alan Taylor objected to keeping the bottom gate locked, as it was a public right of way, and obstructing it would be illegal. It was generally felt by members that the construction of a pedestrianwould be fraught with problems,due to a possible requirement for

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planning permission, and prohibitive cost. Members agreed for C'Ilr Tony Young to research definite costings for this. Members also discussed briefly the other top access, to which the gate had completely gone. Members discussed possible solutions, such as a kissing gate or a staggered fence access entrance. However further discussion was deferred until further notice.
