### Minutes of monthly meeting held at the Village Hall, Rosemarket on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> November 2005

#### Minutes of the October monthly meeting

These were accepted as written (proposer C'Ilr Tony Young, seconder C'IlrRhys Jones).

#### Matters arising

**Back Lane.** Members were informed that P.C.C. were unable to carry out hedge cutting until the litter and debris in the lane had been cleared away. Members settled on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> November at 9-30 am to carry this out

**Beacon gates.** Members discussed the requirements for this, and were agreed that two new posts would be needed to hang any new gate from.

**Access adjacent to The Huntsman.** The Clerk informed members that the access was currently the subject of an ongoing planning application under consideration by the Local Authority. Any decision on whether or not to grant planning consent would be likely to hinge on its acceptability from a highway safety standpoint.

**Wall on Big House Lane.** Members were informed that there was nothing to report at present

**Parking outside Big House.** Members were informed that the enforcement officer was investigating the matter

**Ho-He-Hoïse competition.** C'Ilr David Wildman had been informed by the chairman of Johnston Community Council that he was willing to judge the competition.

**Christmas tree provision.** It was agreed that C'Ilrs Tony Young and Alan Taylor would obtain and put up the tree, this to be done prior to December 3<sup>rd</sup>

**Parking problems in Chapel Lane.** Members were informed that the community police officer had visited the property and spoken to the owner. He had expressed doubts that the lane was publicly owned, or that vehicles had a right to go down it Clarification had been requested by the police on this matter. Members were informed that the lane was a public byeway open to all traffic, maintained by P.C.C. C'Ilr David Wildman to obtain confirmation of this point and Clerk to contact the Police with the information.

**Provision of Sardis noticeboard.** The Clerk informed members that the matter was to be placed on the next agenda for discussion by Burton Community Council

**Rural housing provision.** Members welcomed to the meeting Mr Matthew Owens, Rural Housing Enabler, employed jointly by P.C.C., P.C.N.P.A., and Pembrokeshire Housing Association. Mr Owens distributed to Members copies of a draft survey questionnaire. Members discussed possible changes or additional questions to be included in the questionnaire, as well as possible ways to get it distributed and collected. It was recommended by Mr Owens that December would best be avoided for carrying out the survey. Members decided to place the matter on the agenda for December, for detailed discussion, decisions on final format for the questionnaire and details on method of distribution.

**Chain Jink fencing adjacent to Westaway Park.** Members were informed that the father of the child responsible had agreed to pay for the repair of the fence, expected to be approximately £400.

**Possible formation of a planning sub-committee.** Matter to be placed on agenda for discussion in December.

#### **Public forum**

A member of the public addressed the meeting regarding the problem of miniature motor bikes (monkey bikes) being ridden at speed, and possibly illegally, through the village, as well as the general problem of speeding traffic in the village. Members advised him to contact the police if there was a question over the legality of the monkey bikes being used on public roads. Clerk to invite the community police officer to attend the January 2006 meeting to discuss problems.
