### **Minutes of meeting held at the Village Hall, Rosemarket on Monday 02/02/09**

#### **Minutes of the January monthly meeting**

The minutes were agreed as an accurate record, and signed by the Chairman (Proposer C'lr Barbara Summons, seconder C'lr David Wildman).

#### **Matters arising.**

**Code of Conduct for Members.** The Clerk circulated to Members copies of the notes provided by P.C.C. on the Code of Conduct. C'lr Tony Young declined to take a copy, as a protest at the behaviour of some Members of the House of Lords, who had allegedly been accepting payments for lobbying.

**Pavements in Lucy Walters Close.** C'lr Alan Taylor had been to see the one remaining resident with outstanding work on hedge trimming. He had been informed that the gentleman concerned was waiting for his son to carry out the work. C'lr David Wildman informed Members that a further letter was due to be sent out by P.C.C. soon if the work remained uncompleted.

**Bastleford Road.** Members were informed that the informal meeting with P.C.C. to discuss surface water was still outstanding.

#### **Plans**

##### **Applications**

**08/1051/PA (Extension, 4, Sardis Cross, Sardis)** - Approved. However the consultation had been sent with a period of only two days to reply. This had resulted in an exchange of correspondence and e-mails. A facility had now been set up for written consultations to the Community Council to be received by e-mail. Members were informed that R.C.C. was the first community council to have this facility arranged.

- 4) Welsh Language Board – Reply to letter of submission of scheme – Members agreed to amend the scheme in line with the W.L.B. request. Members thanked the Clerk for his work, and complimented him on the document.
- 5) Kidney Wales Foundation – Information on forthcoming ‘Walk for Life’ fundraising event, 29<sup>th</sup> March 2009 – noted, and retained for donations in May.

### **Discussion of progress on acquisition of school playground**

C’llr Alan Taylor had spoken with the Solicitor’s secretary. They had received acknowledgement of correspondence previously sent, but nothing more recent or substantive. He had asked that a further letter be sent. Members asked the Clerk to get out all the relevant correspondence and documentation in readiness for the March meeting.

### **Discussion of possible memorial to Elsie Barra**

C’llr Barbara Summons informed Members that approximately £600 had been received via the coffee morning event. C’llr David Wildman felt that the Community Council should contribute directly to any such memorial. C’llr Barbara Summons felt that a seat sited at the end of Westaway Park at the junction with Middle Street would be appropriate. C’llr David Wildman felt that a £400 donation from the Community Council, providing a total available amount of £1,000, would be a good sum with which a suitable memorial could probably be provided. The land being considered was in P.C.C. ownership. It was thought that permission would be forthcoming without too much problem. Members were agreed that the first thing to decide was exactly what kind of memorial would be provided, and obtain some estimates. Members were agreed that a seat, along with paving and a tree would be pursued as the likely option.

### **Discussion of Community matters for 2009.**

**Front Window Competition.** Members agreed to drop the competition for 2009, due to lack of support from the community for the 2008 competition.

**Village Tidy-up-day.** C’llr Alan Taylor felt that P.C.C. were doing a good job at present, so Members agreed for this matter to be left in abeyance for the time being.

**Remembrance Day.** Usual arrangements to be made to commemorate this in 2009.

**Land behind the bottle bank.** C’llr Tony Young mentioned that an organisation advertising on the internet was offering a ‘shared responsibility’ scheme. Details to be provided by C’llr Tony Young to the Chairman.

### **Any other business**

**Boundary changes.** Matter to be placed on March agenda for discussion.

**Neyland Road.** C’llr Barbara Summons mentioned the condition of the Neyland Road between Rosemarket village and Neyland. The road surface was breaking up and eroding. It was pointed out that this road fell outside the Rosemarket Community Council area.
