Minutes of the July Monthly Meeting

There was one small amendment to the minutes, namely under ‘Speeding in the Village’, The Beaconing should have read The Beacon.

Matters Arising

Cllr Summons advised that she had spoken to the resident discussed last month in relation to the grass cuttings and to date no further cuttings had been spotted in the village.

Cllr Young advised that maintenance work would be carried out in the near future at St Leonard’s Well.

Planning

Cllr Taylor advised that he had some information on 20mph limit implementation. Matter to be listed on the October agenda for discussion.

Discussion of means to keep unwanted vehicles out of the old school playground

The chairman had received an email from Cllr Wildman advising that the area would have to be closed for one whole day each year, and signs advising ‘park at your own risk’ would need to be erected. RCC would have to provide this signage.

Cllr Young requested that he have permission to go ahead with hedge cutting at the playground before the next meeting. It was agreed that it could go ahead, providing the cost of such was no more than £100.00 to include the removal of any cuttings from the site. All councillors voted in favour of this.

Discussion re Support for Dial a Ride scheme to Neyland

Clerk to also request information on the number of people using the service.

Discussion of problems with vehicles parking on the Milking Bank

Cllr Summons advised that vehicles were still parking on the bank. Cllr Wildman had reported that a bollard had gone missing from the Milking Bank. Clerk to write to PCC asking for a replacement bollard and also request advice on how best to deal with the parking problem. (The two properties concerned are The Chantry and adjoining house).
